



Bribes to Foreign Officials

The Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA) broadly prohibits the payment of bribes to foreign officials in exchange for anything of value. Whistleblowers can report FCPA violations through the SEC Whistleblower Program, which allows successful whistleblowers to recover between 10 and 30 percent of any penalty paid by the wrongdoer.

The FCPA prohibits the payment of bribes to foreign officials for nearly any purpose. Companies pay such bribes for a wide variety of reasons, including:
